



Aotearoa New Zealand ANZSOG Travel Bursary

ANZSOG is pleased to offer a travel bursary for Aotearoa New Zealand students commencing in the Executive Master of Public Administration (EMPA) 2025 cohort.

This bursary is intended to alleviate the costs associated with international travel and can be used at the discretion of the sponsoring agency or department. This may include items such as international flights, accommodation and meals.

Requirements and Conditions

Students must enrol and commence in the EMPA, beginning study in 2025.

Students who defer commencement to later years will no longer be eligible for the bursary.

Bursary Disbursement

The bursary will be realised as a reduction in course fees deducted at the point of invoicing. For agencies and departments paying in full, the bursary will be deducted in full. For those choosing to pay over two years, 50% of the bursary (AUD \$5,325) will be deducted from each year's invoice.

Travel Requirements

It is a requirement of the EMPA that students travel to attend in-person deliveries. For the Aotearoa New Zealand cohort commencing the EMPA in 2025, it is anticipated that international travel will be required once in the first year (2025) and four times in the second year (2026). The 2026 delivery schedule has not yet been confirmed so please note that these are indicative requirements only and subject to change. For students studying over a longer period, this may also impact required travel.

There are no requirements for agencies or departments to report to ANZSOG on the use of the bursary. Its use and distribution are at the sole discretion of the sponsor.

Application Requirements

Applicants will be required to complete and submit an application directly with ANZSOG following any required approvals from their sponsoring agency and the New Zealand Public Service Commission.
